Booking a reservation from the Toledo Hilton site is simple. Click on "Book a Room" to receive your group's preferred rate. See you at the Hilton Toledo in September!



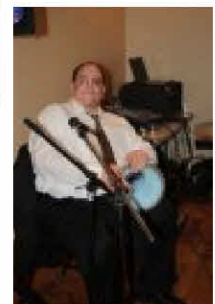

Perry L. Greer III married Lindsey Mulloy in May of 2008. He is now practicing law in Lexington, Kentucky. Perry is the grandson of George H.

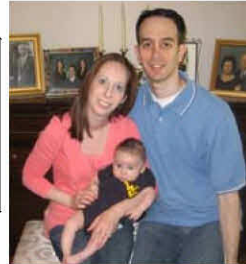
Births
