

BIOGRAPHY BISHOP ELIA (Saliba) of SALAMIA

On Holy Wednesday, April 5, 1972, His Grace, Bishop Elia of Salamia, arrived to the Archdiocesan headquarters from Lebanon to assist Archbishop PHILIP with his various archpastoral duties.



His Grace was born in 1924 in Kfarsaroun near Amioun, Al Koura, North Lebanon. At age fourteen, he entered the Balamand Seminary. After spending five years at Balamand, he moved to Damascus, Syria, where he finished his secondary study and obtained his baccalaureate degree. In 1949, he graduated from Law School of the University of Damascus. In 1950 he was appointed by Patriarch Alexander, III to the Ecclesiastical Court of the Patriarchate and taught Arabic and Mathematics in the Orthodox schools of Damascus. In 1952 he enrolled at the Theological Academy of Khalky, Turkey, and remained there until his graduation in 1956. Upon his return to Damascus, he was appointed a principal of all Orthodox Schools in the city of Damascus. In 1966, he was elected by the Holy Synod Titular Bishop of Salamia and Vicar-General of the Patriarchate of Antioch. When the late Patriarch Theodosius became ill, Bishop Elia administered very efficiently all the affairs of the Antiochian Patriarchate. He speaks the following languages fluently: Arabic, French, Greek and has a good knowledge of English.
