

From the Editor's Desk

Sometimes we ask ourselves, "What am I doing? What is it all about?" I have been reflecting on these questions of late and have a few thoughts to share

Recently a woman and friend my age, also a psychologist, also blond (? natural or bottle), also full figured (ha!), also an only child of deceased parents, also with an only child daughter, suddenly died of a heart attack. This event has made me reflective as we are often wont to do when we lose a beloved peer and I have been re-evaluating certain interests and projects and committments. At the same time I am currently launching several research projects on children and adolescents and self esteem, trying to find out why some youth drop out and fail and others excell in spite of adversity and difficult lives. I know you are asking yourselves, "Where is she going with this and what does it have to do with the Kfeirian Reunion?' It has everything to do with the Kfeirian Reunion, Kfeirians. the Scholarship Endowment, and our proposed trip to Kfeir in the vear 2000.

Kfeirians. Who are we? We are as diverse a group as any American immigrant group. We live far and wide, we comprise every occupational group, we have married spouses from many nationalities. Sometimes we have little in common on a day to day basis, but we have come together every year for 66 years to celebrate our roots, our heritage from a tiny village overlooking snow capped peaks in a land of strife and turmoil far from our American daily lives. We spend countless hours at the malls and ballfields of America, but the little village of the Kfeir still beats in our hearts. The short 3 day reunion that we share marks us indelibly from childhood on with this bond: we are Kfeirians. We share the common heritage of strength and hope and rhythm and laughter of a people that are extraordinary. And more importantly it beats in the hearts and minds and souls of our youth. We have kept this memory alive. The memory of our ancestors, young women and men, scared, alone, coming across an ocean, to what? They did not know. Young men and women, 19, 20, 14, alone, crossing on a cheap boat, not on ocean liners, without even the language of their new land under their belt. Coming for what? A better future, peace, opportunity. Tweels, Radwans, Abourizks, Hannas, Michaels, Deebs, Radwans, Thabets, many surnames all coming, brave, frightened, to seek and create a new life in the "New World." Each year we bring our youngsters, in

diapers and in evening gowns to meet each other and to make friends, to get to know their cousins, perhaps find a spouse!

At our annual reunion, we honor not only the elders that led us from the past to this present we share, but we honor the youth that will lead us into the future. Our Kfeirian Reunion Foundation is the epitome of the American Dream; we are a people firmly committed to democracy and progress who understand and maintain the roots from whence we came. The Kfeirian Reunion Scholarship Endowment Fund assures the future of our children by giving them some suipport for their preparation to lead us. The monetary contribution is important, but nothing compared to the moral support we give when we acknowledge our youth as our future.

And a great future it will be. We are going into the New Millenium. How do our young people want to herald this new century? By making a Kfeirian Reunion pilgrimage back to that tiny village from whence we all descended. The Board of Directors has decided to sponsor a trip to the Kfeir in the year 2000. The Committee for the Kfeir 2000 is young, vibrant, ready to contribute. We want to build this kind of youth, we want to honor this heritage. None of us know how many days we have left. Have you contributed to the Endowment Fund? Do you travel to see your cousins at the Reunion? Have you taught your children the depth of family values that the Kfeirian Reunion can impart? Bring your children in diapers and and with lollipops to meet their cousins, making friends of family and making memories with old friends and meeting new ones. Build their self esteem by giving them a firm understanding of the great men and women from whom they have descended. Reach beyond your singular daily life to link with others who can enrich your lives. In sum, I find no one committment I have more important to my family or myself than the Kfeirian Reunion Foundation.

Next year our Canadian cousins invite us to Prince Edward Island. It is a long way from the tip of Florida to that little island, but in travelling to the new locale of Prince Edward Island we are really going home to our roots.

KFEIR 2000!

The Kfeirian Reunion Board of Directors decided at the April meeting:

1. Not to attempt to hold the Kfeirian Reunion in the Kfeir;

2. To gather information and attempt a Kfeirian trip to the Kfeir in the year 2000;

3. To have the trip during dates when most people could take vacation with students included;

4. To explore the Kfeirian membership's interest and support of such a trip;

5. To contact travel agents experienced in such travel;

6. To start saving our money!

We estimate a trip to the Kfeir and Lebanon will cost approximately \$3000. Since this is a large expense we would like to explore the interest of the Kfeirian community. The trip we have in mind would of course include Beirut, the Bekka, perhaps side trips to Damascus, and at least two or three days in the Kfeir. Several issues need to be decided.

1. When to go. The summer is hot, but that is the time most people are free. Easter in the Kfeir is ideal, but it is hard for families to get away. Those are the two most popular times. The harvest in the fall is wonderful, but impossible for people with children or students, or teachers. Those are the pros and cons of periods of travel.

- 2. Where to go. Many people, once they get there, want to make a grand tour. How long should our trip be and how many stops, etc.
- 3. What kind of accommodations? The Kfeir has no grand hotels. If we are to stay with homes in the Kfeir, there needs to be some type of compensation.
- 4. What activities/sites to visit.
