

General Assembly News 2000

The Constitution was amended to allow for varying the dates of the reunion to allow for optional locations and to solve the Labor Day - school start date problem.

The scholarship amount was raised from \$800 to \$1000.

The Treasurer's Report indicated a checkbook balance of \$1010.93, and Assets balance of \$88,126.21 and contributions this year of \$3,550 for the Endowment Fund and \$1,345 for Memorial Donations. We had a donation of \$2,000 from the Huntington Palmyran Society.

The Board and the Reunion welcomed Mr. & Mrs. Joseph Hajj of the Kfeir to the Reunion. We always love having visitors from the Kfeir. Joseph invited the Reunion to the Kfeir, a dream we had, and will continue to have.

The Vital Statistics Project brought to our attention by Abe Bassett is continuing as a project of the Kfeirian Reunion. Board of Director's Meeting 2000

Dr. Diann Michael was re-elected President, Kevin Donley, Vice President, George Hanna, treasurer, and Selma Edinger, Secretary.

New Board Members elected were Greg Hanna and Becky Thabet Schulz were welcomed to the Board.

Thanks went to Lila Mickel Fischer and Michael Abraham for serving as Board Members for the past three years.

There was much discussion about host cities and how to keep the reunion lively and viable. The Board discussed and then decided to take most responsibility in hosting the reunions instead of waiting for a host city to come forward.

A survey indicated that Las Vegas was the favorite of all sites, and so the Board voted to host the 2001 Reunion in Las Vegas, taking on the task themselves as they are few residents in Las Vegas to create a committee. Jameel Sadd, who lives in Las Vegas, had agreed to help us on site. Each Board member accepted designated responsibilities to make the Vegas Reunion a success.

Future sites were discussed for upcoming Reunions. As Charleston had come forth for the 69th and we placed it in Vegas, there was general agreement that our great 70th Reunion should be at home base in the Tri-State area, and we are hoping for a Charleston Reunion for 2002. Other sites discussed were Raleigh, SC, San Antonio, TX, and Prince Edward Island, Nova Scotia. Cruise Reunions have long been talked about and may be in the works for the future. Montreal was also suggested as a site as was Toronto.

Steve Ramey is the chair of the Constitutional Review Committee charged with the responsibility of reviewing and updating the constitution.

Family members gathered for a breakfast buffet the day after the wedding at a local restaurant.



My name is MATTA Roby, a LEBANESE citizen from south LEBANON (MLEEKH near KFEIR village).

I am a cameraman and my first professional introduction to your village in 1990 , while I was filming a wedding ceremony.

My wife is "Maha Elias ZAKHOUR" (native & habitant of KFEIR), her mother is "Mary Kamil AL GOZ". Her late grand father was "Nimer ABOU KHEIR" who lived and passed away in the U.S.A. . Since then I have filmed more than twenty weddings & occasions in KFEIR, where you can have a fair idea about the main church and other KFEIRIAN cultural and customs. In year 2000 I thought of producing a documentary film about the beautiful sites of KFEIR and their people's traditions (agricultural crop productions and all year celebrations and occasions from January to December).and to point out specially the peaceful coexistence between CHRISTIANS and DRUZ communities. This film contains more then 200 shots (views) assembled in a 2 hour film. The following headlines are: Views of the village (mountains, forests, rivers, fountains, churches, DRUZ holy places , etc.).An interview with the village mayor, with three of DRUZ religious leaders responsible, with the representative of the young women CHRISTIAN association (Y.W.C.A.) in the southern region of LEBANON . The making of traditional bread, The celebration mass (Christmas, Easter, etc.....), The making of traditional cookies of the Easter holiday, Agricultural crop productions: olive oil (from the olive trees to the oil press & finally in the jar); the beekeeping (apiculture) in the village & the honey extraction from the alveolus), the tradition plowing, the season harvest (the wheat in the blade), the manual grinder of the cereals, the traditional extraction of the milk, A real traditional wedding. So through this film you can be in KFEIR with out being in LEBANON . We think you might be interested in our video project, and are at your disposal for further information. Two young girls from the 'Jabbour" family, presumably, perished, one 19 and one 16 - I have been contacting as many names and people with roots in various villages in Syria and Lebanon inquiring as to whether any information passed down through the families have information on these 2 girls or any of the other passengers. Most of the villages and towns that were listed as part of Syria in 1912 now are in Lebanon. Per chance, was there ever any mention of passengers who boarded from Kfeir? Do you have any information on these girls or do any of the family members? Your editor received this and thought it interesting. There are Kfeirians named Jabbour I believe. Any information on this - forward to me at email or street address.

RECEIVED IN THE MAIL:

Dear George:

I just returned from a trip to Lebanon and Syria with a delegation of thirteen people. We went to the Kfeir where we were welcomed by a couple of hundred people, both Christian and Druze. The priest and the head Druze Imam were the leaders in the welcome, and all the Druze Imams turned out to sit in a line for the welcoming. It was heartwarming, and I was in tears about half the time. We went from the village square to my parents' home for drinks. then to the Orthodox Church where the Priest showed us around. The leaders of the village made a number of requests of me, from money for a playground, to a secondary school, to a new water system. I asked them to boil the request down to one item which I could present to the Kfeir reunion and ask for contributions. They settled on the playground, which will cost approximately \$10,000 to build and to stock. They already have the land that has been contributed by another Kfeirian who lived in America.

I promised them that I would make the request for contributions at the reunion in Las Vegas in July. They were pleased at that, and are fully expecting that the American Kfeirians will come up with enough money for the playground. I hope you will be able to suggest this to our reunion members when you next send out a newsletter, and I'll be happy to make an oral presentation at the reunion itselF

Also, I think it would be a good idea for the reunion to raise enough money each year to fund each of the needed projects for the village, starting this year with the playground, then next year for the secondary school, and so on.
